

Flea Treatment Preparation Sheet

Fleas are difficult to eradicate without your help. We have developed a checklist for our customers to complete before and during the treatment process. When this checklist is followed, our flea treatments are more effective.

Steps to prepare for treatment:

- Occupants must vacate the premises for a minimum of 4 hours. (This includes pets). Pregnant women and infants under the age of 6 months need to vacate the premises for a minimum of six (6) hours.
- Arrange to have all pets treated for fleas on the day of service. It is extremely important to have your pets dipped on the same day of service.
- Fish tanks and aquariums should be covered, and the pump turned off for a minimum of one (1) hour. Remove any items that will prevent an area from being treated.
- Place dishes, silverware, pet food, pet dishes, and children's toys in a protected area or seal in plastic bags.
- Wash all pet bedding in hot water or discard outside of the premises. If pet bedding is to be discarded, place it in sealable plastic bags before disposing into exterior trash container.

After treatment - REQUIRED:

- 4 hours after treatment mop all floors (wood, tile, and vinyl)
- 4-5 hours after treatment vacuum all carpeted areas, including all upholstered furniture if possible. Continue to vacuum every day for the next 3-4 days after treatment. The vibrations will draw out anything that may have hatched.
